RESTAURANTS

Tamburino Gold – Abbey Corner, Digby Road, Sherborne DT9 3NL 01935 389053 www.tamburino.co.uk

Excellent Italian family run restaurant serving freshly made pasta/pizzas and meat/fish dishes. Open 7 days a week. Friendly, amazing food and great atmosphere. Booking a table is advisable. Just a short walk from No 4.

The Green – 3 The Green, Sherborne DT9 3HY 01935 813821 www.greenrestaurant.co.uk

A grade II listed building at the top of Cheap Street, the main shopping street of Sherborne. Lovely English food and fine dining with an informal atmosphere. All local sourced, high quality ingredients and extensive range of wine, beers and ciders.

Walk of about 10 minutes, right from our gate up South Street and right up to the top of Cheap Street.

More of a restaurant than a pub, with very good reputation. Again a short walk up South Street and very close to the Abbey.

Open 7 days a week. Serving breakfasts, lunch, tea and evening meals. Lovely family atmosphere, small courtyard seating too. Very short walk from No. 4.

PUBS

Digby Tap – Cooks Lane, Sherborne DT9 3NS 01935 813148 www.digbytap.co.uk

A traditional free house selling a wide range of local and national ales. Home cooked food is available lunchtimes Monday through to Saturday. The building has a long and varied history dating back to c1700. A good place to start your evening in Sherborne with a good lively atmosphere. Very near to Tamburino Gold restaurant, a few minutes walk from No. 4.

The pub has been much loved by locals and tourists for many years, bursting with character. Very friendly staff. Great food from a Sunday roast to a quick pint or two!

Again a 10 minute walk up Cheap Street from our gate.

Great position opposite St. Andrew's Church, Trent. Great pub garden with far reaching views. Gastro pub for special occasions, with a great reputation. Booking a table is advisable. Open every day. Short drive from Sherborne.

Smart country local with far reaching views. Meals are designed to reflect the best seasonally available food, many products grown in their extensive vegetable garden. Booking again is advisable for this special place. Again just a short car journey from Sherborne.



COFFEE SHOPS

There are no shortage of coffee shops in town, here are a few of our recommendations.

Bean Shot Coffee – the nearest to No 4, just a 2 minute walk up South Street South Street, Sherborne DT9 3TD

Open 7 days a week. Serving wonderful Artisan coffee, cakes and light snacks. Not open in the evening.

The Three Wishes – 78 Cheap Street, Sherborne DT9 3BJ 01935 817777 www.thethreewishessherborne.co.uk

Open every day, offering a café/bistro menu, daily specials for lunch. Not open for evening meals. Recently received a Silver Award for sourcing local produce for their menus. Their cakes are delicious and serving many different types of tea. A short walk from No. 4.

D'Urberville – 90 Cheap Street, Sherborne DT9 3BJ

A very quirky coffee/tea shop serving light lunches too on the first floor of St John's Building, quite a few stairs, but worth the climb! D'Urberville sells French style painted furniture and the coffee shop is in amongst the furniture for sale. Very good value. Opens every day apart from Sunday 10 am to 5 pm. Their cakes are absolutely amazing you will be going back for more!

Sherborne Castle Gardens Nursery – New Road, Sherborne DT9 5NR www.sherbornecastlegardensnursery.co.uk

Open every day from 9 am -6 pm, Sundays slightly different timings. A nice stroll from No. 4 walk left from the gate, past side of Sainsburys and over the train crossing and lovely walk over the green area towards the Nursery just left of the Sherborne Castle entrance. Café is very sweet, low key and serves very tasty food during the day. It does get quite busy, so worth saving a table if you want a specific time.

LOCAL ATTRACTIONS

There are so many local attractions in and around Sherborne here are a few of them!

Very local to No 4 within walking distance -

Sherborne Abbey - a glorious building which was founded by St. Aldhelm in AD 705 and has developed from a Saxon cathedral to one of the most beautiful of England's parish churches. For many it is still the 'cathedral of Dorset'.

Pageant Park – just a very short walk from No. 4. Sherborne Castles – New and Old Sherborne Museum

ART GALLERIES

Sculpture by the Lakes near Tolpuddle a 40 minute drive south of Sherborne Hauser and Wirth, Bruton – World Class Gallery

HILL FORTS

Hodd Hill National Trust near Blandford. A large hill fort overlooking Blackmore Vale with amazing views and steeped in history from the Iron Age through to Roman Age. DT11 8TA

South Cadbury Castle just north of Sherborne a short drive. BA22 7HA

A Bronze and Iron Age Hill Fort formerly known as Camalot associated with King Arthur's legendary court at Camelot
